Arterial Scrapbook Series To Be Started Next Week

Beginning next week in the Amsterdam Recorder will be a series of illustrated articles describing various phases of the arterial construction about to be started.

As the series is continued during coming months, pictures of street scenes long familiar but soon to disappear and of buildings, old and comparatively new, scheduled for demolition during the coming year, will be presented.
