1890 HOME GOES - Another West Main St. residence, demolished to make way for the arterial, came in the 1890's and was once the home of James T. Sugden. He moved downtown from 3 Park St. about 1888. Mr. Sugden was a member of the textile firm of Warner, DeForest & Co. and on West Main he was the neighbor of business partner Alonzo DeForest who lived down

the street at what later became the Dr. Seward residence. The Sugden house was acquired as a funeral home by Edwin L. and Jessie P. Wilson on Nov. 19, 1921, and after the death of Mortician Wilson, the business was continued by his widow and their son, Joseph Wilson. The three-story building "disappeared" yesterday. (Donlon)
