

## *Arterial Scrapbook No. 43*



Before Olender furniture outgrew the Market and West Main corner location and began expansion to the west, these buildings along West Main St. witnessed the coming and going of many local business firms. Lindsay & Dodds were at No. 8 West Main as early as 1890 and until 1915. N. B. Shaw's Music House and the Shaw Conservatory were at 11-15 after 1906. The tire business was quite new in 1915 when Merry & Shelp opened here, and Printall & Shelp were their successors through 1945. The Calhoun & Johnson Garage in the rear of The

Barnes had West Main St. entry here, also the meter department of Adirondack Power & Light. Fruchie & Miller taxi was at No. 13. When the McNally lunch wagons disappeared from the Church and Market St. corners, Matty's (Curran) Lunch was opened at 9 West Main for a stay of a couple of decades. Rooming houses, boarding houses and flats that occupied the upper floors in earlier years were gradually taken over by businesses like George A. Clark, watchmaker; Frank Woodson, linens; John Mockry, upholstery, and another longtime furniture man, Joe Wartinger. The buildings date from the past century.
