
## Arterial Scrapbook No. 62



DATES TO 1880s - The third of three houses between Prospect and Academy Sts. to be demolished for widening at the northerly end of the Route 30 arterial project stands at the northwest Academy and Market Sts. corner. Like the other two old residences to the north scheduled for razing, 110 Market St. has been listed in the Amsterdam directories since the 1880's when it was occupied by the family of James McCullough, an engineer. About 1908 it was purchased by James Donlon who a year later began erection of the "Flatiron Bldg." at Market and Shuler.

The Donlon occupation lasted until the early 1930's and since that time there have been various occupancies, the longest of which was by the Dominick Scafidi family. Last owner of the property was the London Estate which gave way to the State Department of Public Works when a survey showed that a careless exit from the front door might mean a drop of about 20 feet to the proposed highway now under contract and scheduled to be finished during the next two years.
