Shuttleworth Park to Get a Historic Marker

The sign directing visitors to Shuttleworth Park lists "Home of ..." to nine groups or activities. That is today. Known in the past as Crescent Amusement Park, Jollyland and Mohawk Mills Park, the park will be honored this year with a NYS Historic Marker.

The park has always been a beautiful site for those wishing a quiet place of natural beauty with gently-flowing waters of the North Chuctanunda Creek. Many people can be seen picnicking or walking the winding trails.

At other times, the park has been a venue for more organized sports and activities. Of course, the baseball field and stands have transformed through the years supporting a wide variety of teams and leagues of all ages and calibers. Most recently, it is the home of the Amsterdam Mohawks, offering a welcoming environment for family fun. It is time to recognize this gem within our city.

Max Reid Awards

In 2012, the Historic Amsterdam League initiated the Max Reid Awards, named after W. Max Reid. Reid was a local funeral director, historian and author. The "Maxie" Award recognizes local individuals and businesses who have done an outstanding job of preserving and presenting their structures.

Architectural Study of City Hall

City Hall, the former home of industrialists Stephen and John Sanford and their families, is a treasure. When talk began of abandoning the building and moving city government functions elsewhere, HAL adopted a resolution opposing such a move.



The city issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the development of a Historic Structure Report (HSR) on City Hall as part of an effort to renovate the building in a historically appropriate manner. The Preservation League of New York State awarded a grant of \$7,500 to support the cost of a report. In 2012, Landmark Consulting LLC, a historic preservation and architectural firm based in Albany, NY was commissioned to develop the Historic Structure Report on Amsterdam City Hall. Last year, the firm delivered their very comprehensive report.

With this report, the city and residents have a guide for "future efforts to secure support for the building's preservation, and provide an outline for public education about the Sanford Mansion's role in Amsterdam's cultural heritage."

Nick Zabawsky, Director of the Urban Renewal Agency and HAL Secretary, presented highlights of the structural report at a HAL public meeting. He also has made CD

copies for those who are interested. The report includes a history of the building including each room, assessments of structural and architectural elements, potential treatments and renovations, complete architectural

drawings and many photographs. It is wonderful piece of work. Contact Nick at Orion Management if interested.

Clock Tower

OK, how many times have you driven up Market Hill and glanced at the clock on the Clock Tower Building and wished it was giving right time (or, if you remember, that it was lit)? HAL President Jerry Snyder went beyond wishing. He and the owners met to discuss "getting the clock moving again." HAL trustees agreed to explore the project.

Michael Kuyt, C. C., a principle in the American Clock Tower Company based in Rochester, NY., who specializes in clock tower restoration was consulted. Kuyt completed a report of the current condition and recommendations for restoration of the clock at the Clock Tower Building.

Given the current age and condition, complete restoration of the clock would be a major and costly undertaking. What is needed are some interested and excited people to undertake fund-raising activities (fun, of course, e.g., "Rock Around the Clock"). 
